The meeting was called to order by President Ian Gillespie at 6:31 PM. Pastor Nancy led the group in the opening prayer.

NOVEMBER COUNCIL MINUTES

John Schlobohm MOVED, Kim Holle seconded, to approve the Minutes of the November 9, 2023, Council meeting with one clerical correction. Motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT

- Reminded Council of Advent services.
- On Christmas Eve (Sunday) there will only be one service (candlelight) at 6:00 PM.
- New Year's Eve service will be at 10:30 AM. Service of the Word/Hymn sing. Pastor Nancy will be away.
- Delivered 22 throw blankets to the Baytown Animal Shelter (overage from Breakfast with Santa).
- Scarlett Rein received her first Bible on December 3, 2023.
- Renewed Robin Dunn's contract of employment on November 11, 2023 –November 20, 2023. (copy filed in Minutes.)
- Confirmation classes continue the first Sunday of every month.
- Recognized office angels Ben Vircant, Ian Gillespie, Debbie Gillespie, Cathleen Mahan, and Sheila Ludwigs.
- Gulf Coast Synod has raised money to pay for internships for our synod. Deadline to apply is January 8. Congregation usually pays for part of internship. Interns would be from one of the ELCA seminaries. After discussion, Council agreed that due to our financial situation, St. Paul's would not be interested in participating in the internship program at this time. Rosie Haas MOVED, John Schlobohm seconded to pass on the internship opportunity. Motion carried with Pastor Nancy voting no.
- Church offices will be closed Monday, December 25, 2023– January 1, 2024.



TREASURER'S REPORT

- Kim Holle presented the financials for the month of November, reporting that expenses exceeded income in the amount of \$7,746.64. John Schlobohm MOVED, Donna Reavis seconded, to approve the report as presented. Motion carried. Congregation is encouraged to remember the importance of giving even when they're not in attendance.
- Kim reviewed the 2024 Budget, which is \$5,000 less than the 2023 budget. It will be presented at the 2024 Annual Congregational Meeting. John Schlobohm MOVED, Rosie Haas seconded, to approve the forecasted 2024 budget as presented. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Insurance Contract

Ian Gillespie presented information regarding St. Paul's insurance and proposed we utilize the company of Jensen Ford for our insurance coverage at a cost of \$39,986 plus workman's comp of \$530 for a total of \$40, 516. Kim Holle MOVED, John Schlobohm seconded, to engage Jensen Ford as our insurance provider beginning January 1, 2024. Motion carried.

Review of Director of Music Ministries Contract

On November 16, 2023, Council was contacted via email with information regarding the permanent job offer to Robin Dunn as Director of Music Ministries of an annual salary of \$19,200, including two Sundays of paid vacation, beginning January, 2024. Ms. Dunn countered and accepted the amount of \$10,000 annually, including the two Sundays of paid vacation beginning January, 2024. Ms. Dunn's contract was signed on November 20, 2023.

Assembly of God Contract

Pastor, Ian Gillespie, and Kim Holle met with Assembly of God pastors and one lay person to discuss and complete signing of the rental agreement. The Assembly of God representatives requested additional hours but were declined due to scheduling conflicts with St. Paul's activities. The contract was signed for six months.
