

Hello sisters and brothers in Christ,

I was driving through Humble, Texas thinking about what it takes to be a humble person, in our fast paced world, with all the competition and drivenness to get ahead. I've heard Tim McGraw's country song about always being humble and kind, and Mac Davis's song, "It's hard to be humble." At its Latin roots, humble means low, grounded. I think of ancient Biblical times of those who bowed low and went down to the ground in the presence of kings, angels and God. I think of the woman who had a daughter with an unclean spirit and came and bowed down at Jesus' feet.

In the Biblical book of James chapter 4:6-7, it reads, "But God gives all the more grace; therefore it says, "God opposes the proud, but God gives grace to the humble." Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you. Draw near to God and he will draw near to you." Keeping God close in your mind and heart, is the path of humbleness.

Jesus lived in humbleness with his love and obedience to God the Father, and he was full of grace that he freely gives us. As Philippians 2:8 states, "he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death-- even death on a cross."

Taking steps of faith, calling on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to forgive our sins, worship and prayer, listening to what the Lord has to say to our heart, moves us closer to God and creates a spiritual environment for humbleness to grow. Being humble before God, our "daily doings" become grace filled, whether it is cleaning toilets or mowing the church lawn in the heat of the summer.

Micah 6:8 He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?
