

Hello sisters and brothers in Christ,

October is Reformation month! All month long, the paraments are red at St. Paul's. Red in the church is significant to remind us that Jesus Christ shed his blood for us on the cross so that we may live. We stand on the Bible witness as did Martin Luther:

"For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God – not the result of works, so that no one may boast." Ephesians 2:8-9.

In the DNA of St. Paul's Lutheran Church and all Lutheran churches is the legacy of Reverend Doctor Martin Luther, who wrote his 95 Theses, which were nailed on the Castle Church door in Wittenberg, Germany, October 31, 1517. The church door was used like a bulletin board where researched ideas, beliefs, and propositions could be posted and discussed in the community. The 95 Theses started a process of reforms to enable Christians to hear and read the scriptures in their own language in worship, pray congregational prayers, sing congregational hymns, confess sin and be absolved in worship, and many other reforms. Buying paper indulgences from the Roman Catholic church to receive salvation was rejected. Here are just a few of his Theses:

Speaking for our Christian treasure: Thesis 62: "The right and true treasure of the Church is the most Holy Gospel of the glory and grace of God."

Speaking for God's gifts of Christ and the Church: Thesis 37: "Every true Christian, be he still alive or already dead, partaketh in all benefits of Christ and of the Church given him by God, even without letters of indulgence."

Speaking in strong, soul rattling language against indulgences as a way of salvation: Thesis 32: "On the way to eternal damnation are they and their teachers, who believe that they are sure of their salvation through indulgences."

By the year 1522 (5 years after he posted his 95 Theses), much of Wittenberg, Germany was celebrating Lutheran worship services and it spread throughout Europe and further. Change and reform for the cause of the Gospel came at a price. Many lost their lives over these reform initiatives. Luther was willing to give himself to studying the Bible in school for many years, read and taught the Bible, learned the original languages of the Bible, reflected, debated, and wrote tremendous amounts to spread the gospel and enlighten and reform the church.

We celebrate Martin Luther's contributions to the witness of the Gospel and our life in the Lutheran Church today, as we pass on the Good News of Jesus Christ!

Lutherans have kept a special day to thank God for the freedom that the word of God arants to believers.


We celebrate the good news of God's grace, that Jesus Christ sets us free every day to do this life-transforming work.

The meeting was called to order by President Ian Gillespie at 6:33 PM. Pastor Nancy led the group in the opening prayer.

AUGUST COUNCIL MINUTES Kim Holle MOVED, Donna Reavis seconded, to approve the Minutes of the August 10, 2023, Council meeting. Motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT

- First Sunday confirmation will begin Sunday, October 1 at 9:30 AM in the parlor, continuing every first Sunday for a 2-year program. This will be for baptized fifth graders and on up to adults.
- Received a request to rent the kitchen/fellowship hall for a birthday party on Saturday, September 30 from 12:00 Noon to 7:00 PM. Renters will arrive at 10:00 AM to decorate. Ian Gillespie volunteered to open and close the church for the party. Kim Holle suggested that we charge an additional \$100 rental fee for the two hours to decorate.
